# Dogs Bane Plectranthus ornatus syn. Coleus canis

here are about 300 species of shrubs and perennials belonging to this genus. Plectranthus ornatus was originally known as Coleus canis before a taxonomic name change took place. Even then it is unclear as the original spelling being canis or canninus, either being a reference to canine or dog due to the effect it has on the animal in question.

#### DESCRIPTION

Originating in Eastern India, Plectranthus or natus is a sprawling perennial with thick, round, succulent leaves with small hairs on the upper surface. Large spikes of mauve-blue flowers appear in summer through to autumn.

The showy flower spikes of Dog Bane make this an attractive addition to the flower garden.

#### **CULTIVATION**

Prefers a sandy, well-drained soil in sun. Protect from heavy frost by planting in a container and locating in a sheltered position.

### **HARVEST**

Plant whole plant where needed or pick leaves when needed.
