

INTRODUCTION

As will be seen from the list there are in all 1783 monuments so far explored and brought on the official list of the Madhya Bharat Archæology Department. This list was prepared after scrutinizing the somewhat incompletely recorded data so far available in all the States of the Madhya Bharat Union. Since there was a regularly functioning Archæology Department only in the former State of Gwalior the records of this State proved to be the most valuable and reliable data for the purposes of the present compilation. Information with regard to the other States had therefore to be gathered from the various scattered sources indicated in the list.

It need hardly be added that the present list does not present a complete picture of all the monuments still surviving in Madhya Bharat. Even the former Gwalior State regions of Madhya Bharat are not fully explored; and this is true especially of those tracts which formed part of the numerous Jagirs in Gwalior State. As regards the other parts of Madhya Bharat there is still good scope for further exploration though it can fairly be estimated that most of the important monuments in these regions have found their place in the present list.

While classifying and numbering the monuments uniformity and accuracy have been maintained as far as possible. Certain discrepancies will, however, be found in the list; for example a solitary and, may be, insignificant herostone has found a separate place in the list side by side with a number of bigger temples grouped fogether and shown as one monument in the list. Besides there are a number of monuments in the list with regard to which sufficient historical and other data could not be furnished satisfactorily. These defects could not, however, be helped as they are inherited from the sources which were available for this compilation.




